LBL 200 Motorcycle Event

As the Responsible Official, Acting Area Supervisor Keith Lannom signed a Decision Memo on 4/2/08 approving the issuance of a special use permit, renewable annually, for the continuation of the LBL 200 Motorcycle Event. Part of the legal road and trails systems will be used for the 200 mile event route. A map of the route is available upon request. A Decision Memo was prepared in accordance with FSH 1909.15. Sec. 31.12, Category 8.

Decision Subject to Appeal

This decision is subject to administrative review (appeal) pursuant to 36 CFR Part 215.

The office business hours for those submitting hand-delivered appeals are: 7:30 AM to 4:00 PM Monday through Friday, excluding holidays. Electronic appeals must be submitted in a common digital format to appeals-southern-regional-office@fs.fed.us. In cases where no identifiable name is attached to an electronic message, a verification of identity will be required. A scanned signature is one way to provide verification.

Appeals, including attachments, must be filed within 45 days from the publication date of this notice in The Paducah Sun. Appeals received after the 45-day appeal period will not be considered. The publication date in The Paducah Sun is the exclusive means for calculating the time to file an appeal. Those wishing to appeal this decision should not rely upon dates or timeframe information provided by any other source.

Individuals or organizations who submitted comments or expressed interest during the comment period specified at 36 CFR 215 may appeal this decision. The notice of appeal must meet the appeal content requirements at 36 CFR 215.

Implementation

If no appeals are filed within the 45-day time period, implementation of the decision may occur on, but not before, 5 business days from the close of the appeal filing period. When appeals are filed, implementation may occur on, but not before, the 15th business day following the date of the last appeal disposition.
